CONSTITUTION - SILVERCREEK AMATEUR RADIO ASSOCIATION

PREAMBLE:

We the undersigned, wishing to secure for ourselves the pleasures and benefits of the association of persons commonly interested in Amateur Radio, constitute ourselves the SILVERCREEK AMATEUR RADIO ASSOCIATION, INCORPORATED (a non-profit organization), and enact this constitution as our governing law. It shall be our purpose to further the exchange of information and co-operation between members, to promote radio knowledge, fraternalism and individual operating efficiency, and to so conduct association programs and activities as to advance the general interest and welfare of amateur radio in the community.

MEMBERSHIP: Article I

All Licensed amateurs interested in radio communications shall be eligible for membership. Membership shall be by application and election upon such terms as the association shall provide by its by-laws.

OFFICERS: Article II

Sec. 1 The officers of this association shall be: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and 3 Trustees.

Sec.2 With the exception of the trustees, the officers of this association shall be elected for a term of one year by ballot of the members present, provided there be a quorum, at the April meeting of said organization. Trustees shall be appointed by the executive committee and serve continuously until resignation or replaced.

Sec. 3 Vacancies occurring between elections must be filled by special elections at the first regular meeting following the withdrawal or resignation.

Sec. 4 Officers may be removed by a three-fourths vote of the membership.

Sec. 5 A member being considered for an office must have been a member of good standing for a period of at least six months prior to his or her election.

Sec. 6 A member being considered to serve as a Trustee must have been a member of good standing for a period of at least three years prior to his or her appointment

DUTIES OF OFFICERS: Article III

Sec. 1 The President shall preside at all meetings of this association, and conduct the same according to the rules adopted. He or she shall enforce due observance of this Constitution and By-laws; decide all questions on order; sign all official documents that are adopted by the association, and perform all other customary duties pertaining to the office of the President.

Sec. 2 The Vice President shall assume all the duties of the President in the absence of the latter. He or she shall organize association member activities, plan and recommend contests for operating benefit, and advance the association interest and activity as approved by this organization. He or she may appoint traffic committees or assistants to aid him in specific branches of activity.

Sec. 3 The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of all meetings, keep a roll of members, accept and submit membership applications, carry on all correspondence, read communications at each meeting, mail written notices to each member, and at all meetings have a copy of this constitution and by-laws. At the expiration of his or her term, he or she shall turn over everything in his or her possession belonging to the association to his or her successor.

Sec. 4 The Treasurer receive and receipt for all monies paid to the association; he or she shall keep an accurate account of all monies received and expended, maintain the association's bank account, report the account balance at monthly meetings, and pay no bills without proper authorization (by the association or its officers constituting a business committee). He or she shall at the expiration of his or her term, turn over all items belonging to the association to his or her successor.

Sec. 5 It shall be the duty of the Trustees to monitor the association's operation with respect to the articles of incorporation and the constitution, and to preserve the registered status of the corporation with the state of Ohio. One

of the trustees shall be the statutory agent for the corporation registered with the state of Ohio to receive all official notices and shall transmit all such communication to the executive committee for action. The statutory agent shall be appointed by the trustees.

MEETINGS: Article IV

The By-laws shall provide for regular and special meetings. At meetings, the membership present, no less than five, including a majority of the officers, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of a business.

DUES: Article V

The association, by a majority vote of a quorum present at any regular meeting, may levy upon the general membership such dues as are deemed necessary for the business of the organization within its objects as set forth in the preamble. Non-payment of such dues shall be cause for the expulsion from the association within the discretion of the membership. The fiscal year of this organization begins with April 1st.

AMENDMENTS: Article VI

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the total membership. Proposals for amendments shall be submitted in writing at a regular meeting and shall be voted on at the next following regular meeting, provided all members have been notified by mail, or electronic messaging system, of the intent to amend the constitution at said meeting.

ASSESTS: Article VII

The association shall have the authority to purchase, lease, rent, or dispose of any of its properties.

TECHNICAL COMMITTEE: Article VIII

Sec. 1 The association shall maintain a Technical Committee, comprised of members of good standing with expertise in electronics or the radio art and in working with the association's on the air radio equipment. The members of the Technical Committee shall be responsible for maintenance and repair of the association's on the air radio equipment, and to make recommendations as applicable from time to time to the association officers on improvements or changes to the on the air radio equipment.

Sec. 2 The Technical Committee shall as applicable, offer technical advice to members concerning equipment design, selection, and operation to assist in observance and compliance with the state of the radio art and the rules and regulations set forth for the Amateur Radio Service by the Federal Communications Commission.

Sec. 3 The Technical Committee shall be led by an Operations Manager, chosen by the committee from among its members. The Operations Manager shall have clearly demonstrated expertise in the radio art and shall be the custodian for all association properties.

Sec. 4 The Operations Manager shall serve as the association's license trustee for all of the association's on the air radio equipment. He or she shall hold a valid Extra Class license.

Sec. 5 The members of the Technical Committee shall be appointed by the association's Trustees at the April meeting to serve a one year term. There shall be no limit on the number of terms a member may serve on the Technical Committee.

BY-LAWS: Article IX

The By-laws shall more clearly define the above listed articles of the constitution and can be established or modified at a regular meeting by the simple majority vote of a quorum.

RULES: Article X

Robert's Rules shall govern proceedings.
